If our mind's eye were powerful enough to penetrate ever so little into the immensity of His sovereign excellence, *Jesus!*, with what lofty sentiments we'd be filled!" *Conference 30 of St Vincent de Paul*.

- The Holy Trinity"



Let us make this meditation our own over the next few days before we celebrate the birth of Jesus. Let's remember to pray, "Come! Come Lord Jesus! Come into our heart. Amen."
